- **Oct. 1** Early afternoon departure by private charter ground transportation to Toronto , Pearson Airport. An early evening non stop flight will take us to Paris.
- Oct. 2 Paris On arrival in Paris we will transfer to our hotel located on the left bank in the Latin Quarter. The remainder of the day is at your leisure. We will meet early evening for dinner at a local restaurant. Overnight Paris. D

A short distance away Compiegne Forest, the site of the Armistice ending WWI in 1918 and in June 1940 after the Battle of France in World War II. We continue to Bayeux for overnight B, D
- Oct. 5 D-Day Landings / Juno Beach Morning tour of Pegasus Bridge near Sword Beach where the British 6th Airborne Division spearheaded the entire D-Day landing forces with a daring pre-H-Hour glider assault. We can have lunch at the famous Gondree Café, the first home in France liberated by the Allies on D-Day. We visit Juno Beach in the afternoon; with a stop at the infamous "Canadian House" at Bernieres-sur-Mer. There is time at Juno Beach Centre Museum and a guided tour of the beach fortifications, Canadian memorials and monuments. Overnight Bayeux. B, D
- Oct. 6 Gold Beach / Medieval Bayeux

 Today we continue our Tour of the D-Day Landing Beaches with a visit to the only German Coastal Battery in the Atlantic Wall which still has the original guns in place: Longues-sur-Mer. Our next stop is the scenic seaside town of Arromanches (Gold Beach), where we will enjoy a special film presentation of "100 Days of Normandy"; and see the remains of the greatest engineering feat of invasion: Project Mulberry, the artificial harbour. After lunch we return to Bayeux where you will have time to visit the town and Cathedral to see the famous Bayeux Tapestry.

 Overnight Bayeux. B
- Oct. 7 The Dieppe Raid and Somme

 Check out of our hotel and continue east to the delightful Pays d'Auge where we will enjoy a visit to a traditional French cheese manufacture. We visit one of Normandy's prettiest villages, Beuvron-en-Auge with free time to explore and enjoy lunch. This afternoon we continue along the coast to the Dieppe Canadian War Cemetery at Hautot-sur-Mer. The Canadian led Dieppe Raid of August 18-19, 1942 was the first large-scale daylight assault on a strongly held objective (port) on the Continent since the allied withdrawl in spring 1940. After a photo stop at Dieppe port we continue to our hotel in Amiens for the night.

 By Check out of our hotel and continue east to a traditional French cheese manufacture.
- Oct. 8 Somme and Vimy Battlefields We continue our tour to nearby Albert to visit the fascinating Battle of the Somme 1916 Museum. This museum recreates WWI scenes telling the tale of trench warfare in the Somme. Our journey continues with a guided tour of the Somme Battlefields including as stop at Beaumont-Hamel and Newfoundland Memorial Park. In the afternoon we visit Vimy where we will see the Memorial to the Canadian Forces which honours those who took part in capturing Vimy Ridge in April 1917. Here we will discover Canadian and German trench systems as well as the scarred landscape. We will continue north to Ypres, Belgium to experience the very moving "Last Post" ceremony at Menin Gate. Overnight Ypres. B, D
- Oct. 9 Ypres and Passchendaele After breakfast and check out we continue exploring Flanders and Belgium starting with a visit to the impressive Memorial Museum at Zonnebeke which focuses on the horrendous Battle of Passchendaele. We will also stop at the Canadian Hill 62 Memorial and Cemetery. After lunch we continue to the beautiful city of Brugge with it's lovely canals. Overnight Brugge. B, D
- Oct. 10 Brugge at Leisure After breakfast we will enjoy an exciting Guided tour of Brugge including stops at the most significant sites in majestic Old Town. Following the tour the remainder of the day is at your leisure to wander the quaint, winding streets, visit museums, shop for lace or chocolate, take a canal cruise or simply relax in this beautiful city. Overnight Brugge. B

- Oct. 11 The Battle of the Bulge Leaving Brugge we continue our historical and cultural adventure across Belgium to the Ardennes. The result Hitler's surprise 1944 attack in the area became known as The Battle of the Bulge. This morning we start with a visit to see "Easy" Company's foxholes near Foy (101st Airborne Division, from the Band of Brothers). We continue to Mardasson (American Memorial) on the outskirts of Batogne. Afternoon visit to the 101st Airborne Division Museum with free time in the town centre. Overnight Bastogne. B, D
- Oct. 12 Maginot Line / Westwall

 This morning we drive through the Grand
 Duchy of Luxembourg to the French Elsass and the Vosges National Park. Visit
 the Hagenau Sector of the infamous Maginot Line, with a guided tour of the
 "Limekiln" Fortress at Ouvrage du Four-a-Chaux (Lembach). We then transfer
 over the border to Pirmasens, Germany for a guided tour of the impressive
 Westwall Museum. The museum is located inside the largest bunker in the socalled Westwall or "Siegfried Line". Our overnight stop is Heidelberg.

- Our adventure continues south via the German Romantic Road with lunch enroute to Rothenburg. We have an afternoon guided tour of Rothenburg including stops along the old, medieval city wall and ramparts, Markplatz (Market Square) and Herrngasse (Street of Lords). We have a late afternoon transfer to Nuremberg for overnight stay.

- Oct. 14 Nuremberg Rallies / War Trials We start the day with a stop at the East Wing of the Palace of Justice (Nuremberg Courthouse), where the International Military Tribunal was held after the war. We will see the Imperial Fortress and the old town square. We then have an afternoon tour of the former Nazi Party Rally Grounds, where Hitler staged his grand propaganda spectacle. Our tour follows the history and development of the Reichsparteigelande, including sites such as the World War I Memorial at Luitpold Grove, The Zeppelin Field , Grandstand , Great Road and Congress Hall where we will visit the documentation Centre Museum. Overnight Nuremberg. B, D
- Oct. 15 Nuremberg—Berchtesgaden After breakfast we will drive leisurely from Nuremberg to Berchtesgaden. On arrival we will have short orientation to the town and the remainder of the day is at your leisure .

 Overnight Berchtesgaden. B, D
- Oct. 16 Eagle's Nest and Berchtesgaden After breakfast we climb Germany's highest alpine mountain road to the infamous Eagle's Nest, formerly Hitler's mountaintop Tea House and conference centre. We will hear details of its engineering and construction as well as its use during a guided tour of the building. After lunch we will visit the former Diplomatic Guest House (now a Documentation Centre) and wartime air-raid shelters (bunker system). We continue back down to the village for short visit to the Enzian Schnapps Distillery for some free sampling of the local Grassl Schnapps, made from the root of a wild alpine flower. Overnight Berchtesgaden. B
- Oct. 17 Salzburg and Lake Konigssee We start with a short journey across the border to Salzburg, Austria. We will have walking orientation of the old town. Highlights include the Salzburg Cathedral, Mozart's birth house, medieval Getreidegasse shopping street and St. Peter's Monastery. We begin our return to Berchtesgaden and enjoy a relaxing, scenic cruise on Lake Konigssee in the heart of the Berchtesgaden National Park. Overnight Berchtesgaden B, D
- Oct. 18 Munich After breakfast we will transfer to Munich. On arrival we have a driving tour of the city's historical highlights; including the Haus der (Deutschen) Kunst, the University (home to the White Rose resistance movement) and Konigsplatz (site of the 1938 Munich Accords). After lunch we will finish with a walking tour of the old city including the most significant locations of Hitler's unsuccessful 1923 Beer-Hall Putsch. We will also see many historical sites connected with the Nazi Party and the occult Thule Society, the sinister group and benefactor behind the German Workers Party. Remainder of the day is free to enjoy Munich before meeting for a farewell dinner at a local restaurant. Overnight Munich B, D
- Oct. 19 Homeward Bound The morning is free to relax with a leisurely breakfast or visit the old town again on your own. We depart Munich mid afternoon for Toronto. On arrival our private chartered ground transportation will meet us for transfer to London Welcome Home
